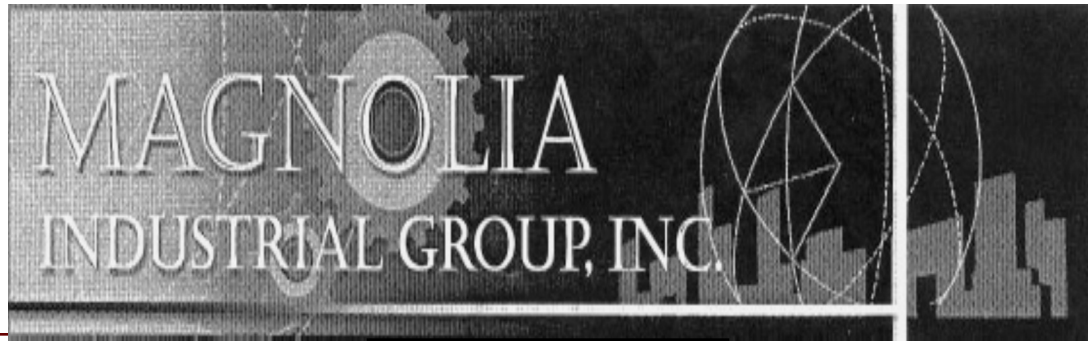

On July 15, 2003, tried to then again on July 23, 2013, the City Council of the City of Long Beach (“City Council”) re-established the Magnolia Industrial Group Property and Business Improvement District (“District”), pursuant to the provisions of the *Property and Business Improvement District Law of 1994* (“the Law”) *Division 18 of the Streets and Highways Code, commencing with Section 36600.*

The District falls within a 24 -block area generally located east of San Francisco Avenue, south of Pacific Coast Highway, west of Magnolia Avenue and north of Anaheim Street, with an extended portion west of the Southern Pacific Railroad Right of Way, south of Anaheim Street, north of 12th Street and east of De Forest Avenue.

COVID 19 CITY UPDATES

From the Economic Development Department:

Good afternoon. Following is today's Business Brief from the City of Long Beach Economic Development Department. We are continuing to ensure you are updated on resources and services for businesses and the latest news.

LISC Small Business Relief Grant

- The Small Business Relief Grants, which are part of LISC's Rapid Relief & Recovery Fund programs to help businesses with immediate financial support, is now open for applications.
- Grants will be made in the amounts of \$5,000, \$7,500, and \$10,000.
- Applications must be completed by Wednesday, May 20th, 8:59 p.m. (PT). Before completing the application, we recommend you review the Grant Information Overview and FAQ, [which can be found here](#).
- Priority will be given especially to entrepreneurs of color, women-and veteran-owned businesses, and other enterprises in historically under-served places who don't have access to flexible, affordable capital. To apply, click on the following link: <https://lisc.tfaforms.net/38>.

Update to the City's Safer at Home Order

On May 13, 2020, the City updated the City's [Safer at Home Order](#).

- The Order allows the following "Lower-Risk Businesses" to operate:
 - Beauty supply
 - Bookstores
 - Clothing and shoe stores
 - Florists
 - Hobby Stores
 - Home and furnishing stores
 - Jewelry stores
 - Music stores
 - Retail ONLY for hair salons, barbers, art galleries, museums, spas, wellness centers. Services are not allowed.
 - Sporting goods stores
 - Tobacco retailers

- Toy stores
 - Car dealerships
- Pet services for curbside pickup and drop off. Includes pet grooming, dog walking, training. Additionally, it allows the following recreational businesses to operate:
- Equipment rentals such as kayaks, standup paddleboards, kitesurfing, and electric boats.

Gondola rides, bike share, and scooter share are still prohibited. Businesses that are allowed to operate must implement and post a Physical Distancing Protocol prior to operating.

- The City of Long Beach is preparing to release a RFP to solicit proposals to partner with local restaurants to deliver up to three (3) nutritious meals to qualified seniors enrolled in the Great Plates Delivered Program.
- Great Plates Delivered is intended to help support both eligible seniors and the hard-hit restaurant industry in Long Beach.
- Interested restaurant operators must register as a vendor with the City of Long Beach prior to submitting a RFP. UPDATE FROM THE COUNCIL DISTRICT

As of Today in Long Beach We Have:
1,298 total positive results
Daily reporting of case counts continues to fluctuate due to heavy demand for testing (due to the wider scope of testing criteria) and backlog at various laboratories, causing delays in reporting.

51 fatalities
66 people hospitalized
Approximately 830 recovered (Please note that, for low-risk patients recovering at home, recovery data is self-reported.)

Details Regarding Fatalities: 40 are associated with long-term care facilities

One individual in their 40s, three individuals were in their 50s, ten were in their 60s, eight were in their 70s and 29 were over 80 years old
28 individuals were men and 23 were women

All had underlying health conditions
At this time, to avoid risk to patient privacy, no further details will be provided

Testing Results Update: Please note that most test results will be processed in 7-10 days.

TRADE VOLUMES CONTINUE TO FALL

Dockworkers and terminal operators at the Port of Long Beach moved nearly 520,000 shipping containers during April,

a more than 17% decrease from the same month last year—the port’s busiest April on record. The decrease is a direct result of COVID-19, port officials said.

“We look forward to a recovery stage and rebounding cargo shipments as the nation contemplates relaxing shelter-in-place orders, people return to work and consumer demand rises—however, it will not be in the short term,” port Executive Director Mario Cordero said in a statement.

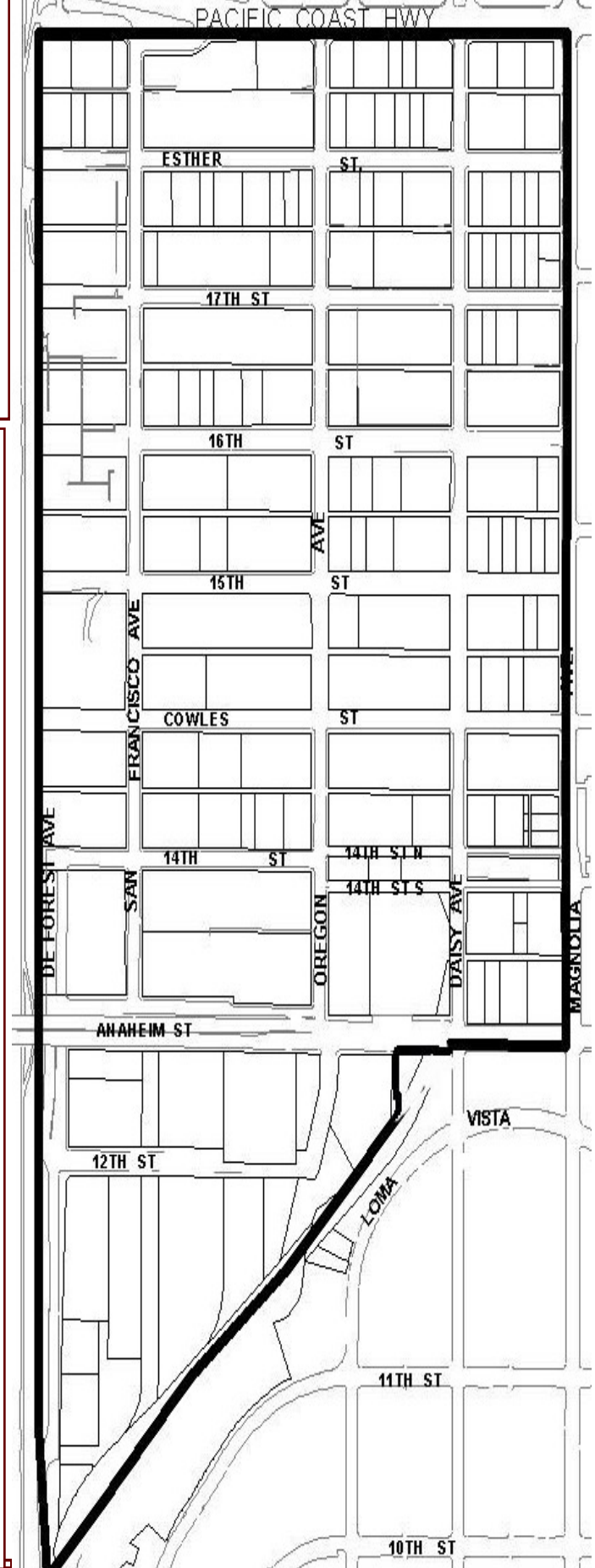
Imports decreased more than 20%, while exports declined more than 17% and empty containers sent overseas dipped more than 12%. During the first four months of the year, the Port of Long Beach moved 2.2 million containers, down 9.5% from the same period in 2019.

Falling consumer demand brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic drove imports down, while a shift in carrier services negatively impacted exports, port officials explained.

The Port of Long Beach had only one canceled sailing in April, but officials are prepared for more. In all, the San Pedro Bay port complex, which consists of the Long Beach and Los Angeles ports, expects 48 canceled vessel voyages from April 1 through June 30—16 of which are scheduled for Long Beach. Combined, both ports recorded 10 canceled sailings during the same time last year.

“Continuing to engage with our partners, stakeholders and the community is of the utmost importance at this time,” Long Beach Harbor Commission President Bonnie Lowenthal stated. “We are striving to live up to our duty to keep goods moving through the supply chain during this crisis.”

Statewide, trade with China, Hong Kong and Macau through was down 34% in March. Total California goods exports were down 12.8%, or \$2 billion, compared to March 2019.
